- All horses must be in stalls 24 hours prior to expected landfall of storm.
- A negative Coggins is required for each horse and will be checked when you check your horse(s) in.
- Owners are responsible for feeding and watering their own horses and providing their own buckets. Owners are responsible for stall cleaning during the time horse is on premises. Staff will not clean stalls until horses have vacated.
- Owners must leave facility prior to storm's arrival and should ensure that there is plenty of hay and water left for their horses.
- After storm, Escambia County staff will check on horses and will fill water buckets in stalls and stock pens.
- Horses must be removed no later than 72 hours after storm has passed through. Horses that are not removed within 72 hours will be turned over to animal control or the county livestock officer and additional fees/fines may incur.
