

- Household appliances and electronics
- Yard waste Household junk and debris
- Bicycles and toys
 Barbecue grills
- Old furniture and mattresses
- Household hazardous waste (old paint, motor oil, chemicals, batteries)
- Tires (limit 10 per household)

- Building materials (concrete, bricks, blocks, roofing, drywall or lumber)
- Explosives or ammunition Dirt or sod
- Vehicles/vessels 55-gallon drums of fluids
