












Infrastructure Needs

- Include upgrading of dune crossovers on Pensacola Beach. These facilities suffered from loss of use during the event
- Include upgrading of crosswalks on Pensacola Beach as a life safety issue
- Include shoulder stabilization on streets and roads on Pensacola Beach.
- Include boardwalk on Pensacola Beach on sound side in Core area for walkable community infrastructure
- Include improvements to Park East, Park West, and Quitewater (Mom's Beach). Suffered loss of use during event
- Include Casino Beach facility and parking upgrades. Suffered loss of use and direct impact from oil product
- Include multi use path upgrades on Pensacola Beach
- Include the expansion of effluent reuse on Pensacola Beach as a water quality need
