



Project Overview

The FDOT is conducting a PD&E study to analyze the existing characteristics, evaluate community needs and impacts, and develop proposed conceptual improvements along the Navy Boulevard corridor from New Warrington Road to the Bayou Chico Bridge. The study area is approximately 1.4 miles in length, contains three signalized intersections, and serves as a significant regional arterial connection within the Pensacola community. Navy Boulevard also serves as an important regional link between community assets that includes Naval Air Station (NAS), Pensacola and the downtown Pensacola business district. The intent of the study is to find solutions to improve roadway, bicycle, pedestrian, transit, business accessibility, and parking. As well as, encourage economic development, increase intersection level of service, streetscape, and drainage improvements. The improvements should also increase safety, augment emergency evacuation capabilities, facilitate tourism, and the movement of people and goods.






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Purpose
