Project Overview

Escambia County's Construction Management Division will soon begin the Beach Haven Northeast Phase II Sanitary Sewer and Drainage Improvement Project in District 2. This project is a joint project between Escambia County and Emerald Coast Utilities Authority (ECUA). The project provides enhanced stormwater improvements and sanitary sewer services to all lots located in the Beach Haven neighborhood. The project extends from Gulf Beach Highway on the south to Jones Swamp on the north, Fairfield Drive on the west to Colbert Avenue on the east. Construction is expected to begin in September 2023 and be completed within 760 days (approximately 2 Years), weather permitting.

Resident Information

- Construction for this project is funded by the Local Option Sales Tax (LOST), the County Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA), Emerald Coast Utilities Authority (ECUA), BP Oil Spill Recovery Funds, and Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) RESTORE and Resilient Grants for a cost of \$20,934,055.76.
- Roads Inc. will be the contractor for this project.
- Mott McDonald will provide construction inspection for the County on this project and will monitor construction activities daily. ECUA will also have an inspector on-site daily.
- Construction is expected to take place during the hours of 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday.
- Areas that are outside the limits of construction but impacted during construction will be returned to their previous state.
- Access to adjacent properties will be maintained, although there may be periods when a driveway or entrance is temporarily blocked during construction.
- Your cooperation and patience are appreciated during this construction process.
